The presiding officer may exercise his or her discretion, subject to reversal by a majority of the Commission, in conducting the public comment period, including, but not limited to: reordering the order of business; determining an equitable amount of time that each member of the public may speak; granting or denying speakers additional time to speak, individually or collectively.
